PENSIONS AND PROCEDURES FOR PENSIONS AND GRATUITIES

PENSIONS

GENERAL

1. A pension is a regular payment to people who have served in the Armed Forces for a specific period

QUALIFICATION

2. Discharge from the forces on the following grounds entitle an officer/soldier to qualify for a pension:
 - a. Age. Discharge from the forces on reaching the age of fifty-five.
 - b. Voluntary Discharge. Voluntary resigning from the service.
 - c. Service No Longer Required. When the Armed Forces terminates your service.
 - d. Medical Ground. When an officer or soldier is no longer medically fit to continue in the Armed Forces.
 - e. Compulsory Retirement (Redundancy). When the Armed Forces makes a person redundant.
 - f. DISMISSAL.

GRATUITY

3. Gratuity is a payment given to an officer or soldier in appreciation for the number of years served in the Armed Forces. To qualify for a gratuity in the Forces an officer/soldier has to have served a minimum of 10 years service.

EX-GRATIA

4. Ex-Gratia is a payment given to officers and soldiers who have served less than 10 years in the Armed Forces in appreciation for their service rendered. ANYONE WHO RECEIVES EX-GRATIA DO NOT QUALIFY FOR A PENSION.

COMPUTATION OF PENSION, GRATUITY AND EX-GRATIA

5. Examples of how to calculate the amount of money a officer or soldier will receive are at Annex A.

ANNEX A TO PENSIONS
INSTRUCTION

EXAMPLES OF HOW TO CALCULATE PENSION, GRATUITY AND EX-
GRATIA

✓ PENSION AND GRATUITY

12160000 PTE IONES enlisted into the Armed Forces on 1 September 1974 and was discharged on the 14 December 2002 as a WO1.

Computation:

	Year	Month	Day
Date of Discharge	2002	12	14
Date of Enlistment	1974	09	01
Years of service	= 28	3	13

Therefore Pensionable = 28 years, 3 months and 13 days

Convert years and months served into months only

Therefore = 28 years x 12 months + 3 months = 339 months¹

Basic Salary² = 171,360,00 leones
Annual Salary = 171,360,00 leones X 12 months = 2,056,320 leones *

To work out the pension the following formula is used:

Annual Salary multiplied by number of completed months divided by 600

Therefore 2,056,320 leones x 339 divided by 600 = 1,161,820.80 leones

A full pension without gratuity would therefore be 1,161,820.80 leones per year
A monthly pension would therefore be 1,161,820.80 divided by 12 = 96,818.40 leones.

When a gratuity is claimed the officer or soldier is given a reduced pension:

Divide the full pension by 4 and multiply by 3 to get the Reduced Pension

1,161,820.80 divided by 4 x 3 = a reduced annual pension of 871,365.60
Therefore the monthly pension = 72,613.80 leones

The gratuity is worked out by dividing the full pension by 4 and multiplying by 12.5
Therefore 1,161,820 leones divided by 4 x 12.5 = 3,630,690 leones

¹ Only completed months count towards the calculation.
² Basic salary does not include allowances.

EX GRATIA

131 0000 PTE SMITH enlisted into the Armed Forces on 20 September 1991 and was discharged on the 8 April 2001 as a Pte.

	Year	Month	Day
Date of Discharge	1991	04	08
Date of Enlistment	2001	09	20
Years of service	0	06	18

Basic salary³ = 49,600
Annual Salary = 595,200 (49,600 x 12 months)

To work out the Ex Gratia = Annual Salary divided by 15 x 9

Therefore 595,200 divided by 15 x 9 (= 357,120.00 leones)

³ Basic salary does not include allowances
